Scholarships for entry

A report and references will be requested from your current school in support of your application.

A Secondary Scholarship application form must be completed by the parents of the candidate and signed by the Head of their current school.

Academic Scholarships

This consists of an English paper, a general paper based on a choice of short essay options and an interview.

Successful candidates will be expected to demonstrate outstanding applications in their specific field and to represent the school as an academic role model and beacon for younger students.



Performing Arts Scholarships

Performing Arts scholarships are awarded to candidates with an extraordinary skill in acting or musical vocal performance or an aptitude in theatre production skills. Candidates are required to submit a review of a recent theatre production they have seen or participated in, a week before the assessment. Acting pupils will present a monologue of their choice. Music candidates will perform two pieces of music or songs of their choice. All applicants may discuss a production discipline they have had previous experience of or a passion for (lighting, sound, costume, etc.) Candidates will be asked about their experience of musical theatre or drama, based on their submitted review. Students may submit a short video of their own performances (no longer than 10 minutes).

Successful candidates will be expected to take a leading role in school productions and act as a role model for younger aspiring performers.

Closing date for entry:

Monday, 1st March 2021.

Date of examination/assessment for Sixth Form Scholarships and Awards:

Tuesday, 30th March 2021.



Art Scholarships

This will be judged on the basis of a portfolio of work brought on the day of the examination, an interview and a short art test.

Successful candidates will be expected to exhibit their work at appropriate events and to display examples of outstanding creation on a semi-permanent basis.



Music Scholarship

Candidates should offer two instruments (which may include voice), one of at least Grade 3 level, one of which should be an orchestral instrument or similar (violin, viola, cello, double bass, trumpet horn, trombone, tube, flute, clarinet, bassoon, saxophone, orchestral percussion, guitar, piano, etc). Candidates will be required to play two contrasting pieces on their first instrument and one piece on their second. Candidates will be interviewed by the Head of Music and a member of the school's Senior Leadership.

Successful candidates will be expected to perform in public at appropriate occasions and to avail themselves of all opportunities provided for performance in the school.



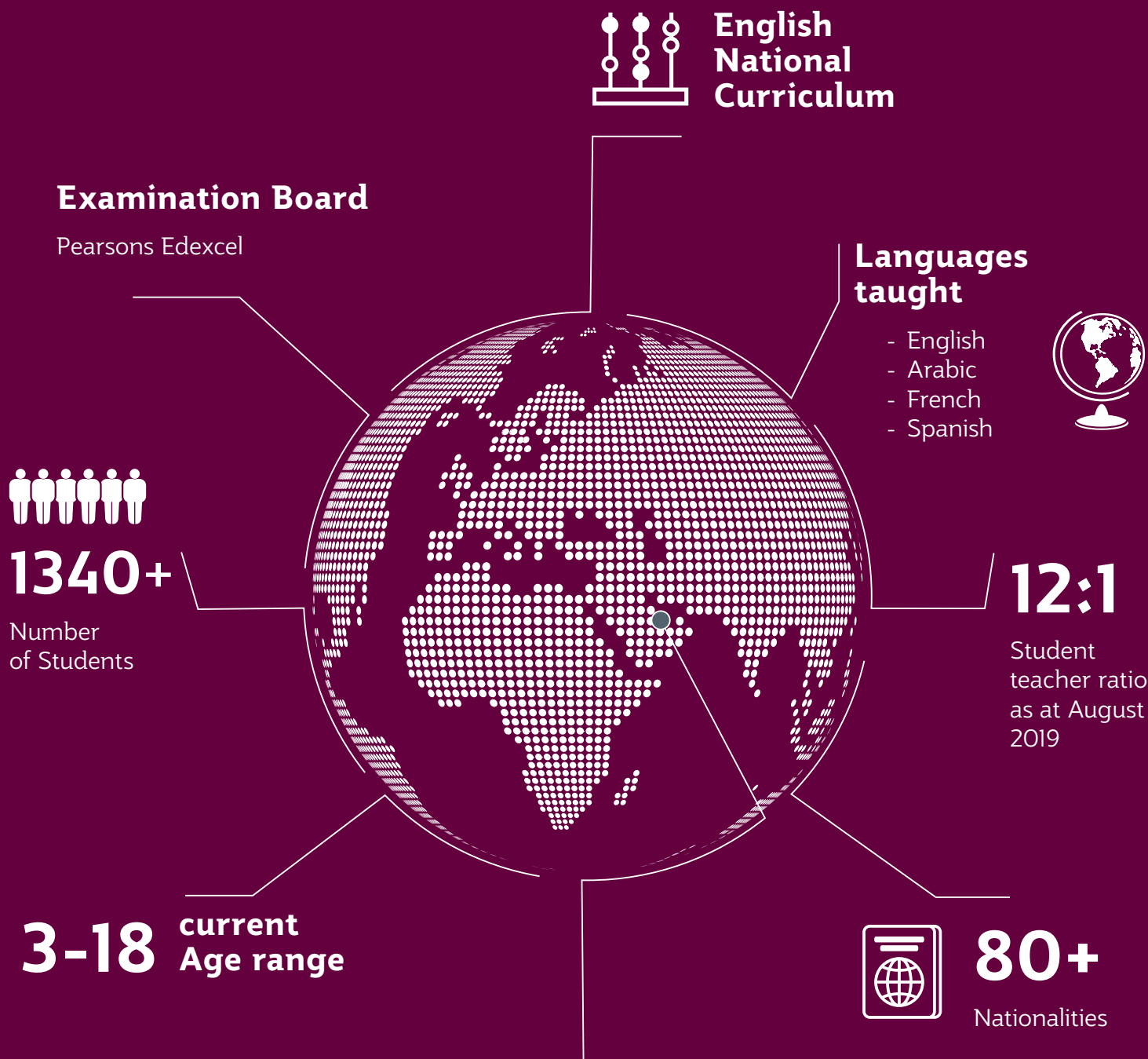
Sports Scholarships

Candidates should have represented their school's own sports teams as a regular and leading participant throughout their time there. They will be asked to demonstrate their ability/potential on the assessment day.

Each candidate should submit a record of their sporting achievements over the last one to two years. They will be interviewed by a member of the school's Senior Leadership and the Head of Physical Education. Reports will be required from representative coaches and from their present school. Candidates may include a short video to support their application (no longer than 10 minutes).

Successful candidates will be expected to represent the school in at least two sports and to provide an example of excellent sports leadership for fellow team members.
